TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Many people think that Saint Francis originated the Christmas crèche, but its origins go far back. The Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome has housed what is said to be relics of the cradle of Jesus since the seventh century. In time, every year during the Christmas season the reliquary (container for relics) was surrounded by an increasingly grand three-dimensional scene of the place of Jesus' birth. Rocks and trees, houses, streams, figurines of villagers going about their daily tasks were all included. It was a very dramatic presentation. If you've ever seen an elaborate model train installation, you get the idea. The proper term for this depiction is presepio, from the Latin word for "surround" or "hedge."

Over the centuries, the custom spread first to churches, and then to aristocratic homes. In Italy, whole chapels are often set aside for the presepio, and it is not unusual to have hundreds of figures. It can sometimes be a challenge to locate the Holy Family amid the crowd, almost like a Where's Waldo? children's book. The oldest surviving presepio is in St. Mary Major and dates from the thirteenth century, although many pieces have been broken or lost. Saint Francis of Assisi took a decidedly creative step in 1233 in the village of Greccio, when he directed his followers to fill a manger with hay and tether an ox and ass nearby. He then invited the villagers to attend Mass outdoors near the crib, the worshipers themselves becoming a living presepio. By the seventeenth century, the tradition was well-established, particularly in Naples, and had a firm hold in Portugal, Spain, and in the Provence region of France. Today, it is not unusual to find presepios with five hundred figures, a vivid reminder of Emmanuel, God-with-us!

NEWS OF COMFORT

In a time of preparation, much of it having to do with material things, it is good to hear the words of Isaiah, "Comfort, give comfort to my people, / says your God" (Isaiah 40:1). In a time of such stress and rush, when our usual burdens are augmented by piles of Christmas preparations, we can choose to slow down, take some time to heal, and appreciate the enormous gift we are about to receive. Christ, the Son of God, has become one of us, and knows our human limitations.

Yet God, even now, is freeing us from the burdens that our inattentiveness to our God and to our deepest inner longings have heaped upon us. The Lord comes, not as a king with mighty armies, but as a shepherd leading the flocks with care and tenderness. Isaiah prophesies good news: our oppression is over, our sins forgiven. The savior we have awaited is coming, not the first time, but in the end times, as our salvation.

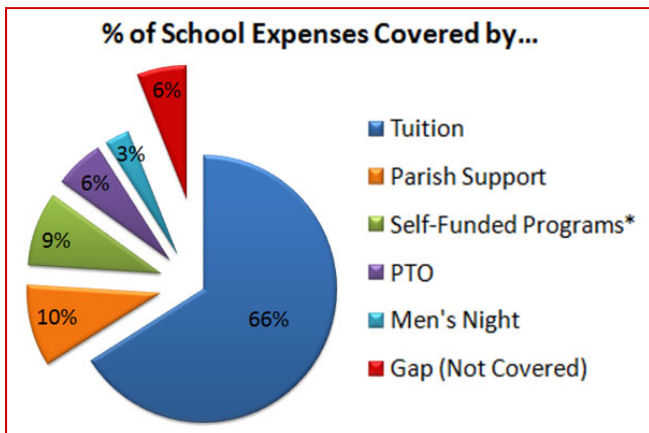
2017-2018 ST. JOSEPH CATHOLIC SCHOOL GAP CAMPAIGN

DURING MASS

Why are we no longer "enthroning" the Book of the Gospels after the Gospel is proclaimed? The respect given to the Book of the Gospels is meant to highlight the special nature of the Gospel's proclamation at Mass. The Book of the Gospels can be carried in procession at the beginning of Mass, it is placed on the altar before the Gospel reading, and it is incensed when incense is used. All of those actions happen before the Gospel is proclaimed at Mass and in some way prepare us for that proclamation. After the Gospel reading is finished, the situation changes. There is no incense used for the book after the Gospel reading. Also, at the end of Mass, the book is not carried in procession. Given those differences, it seems appropriate to simply place the Book of the Gospels in the ambo after the Gospel has been proclaimed. Thus, when we respond "Glory to you, O Lord," we should simply sit down without waiting for anything to be done with the Book of the Gospels.

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

As she was stringing her Christmas lights Paula pondered the unsightly stump in her yard. Last spring she had noticed that her pretty red bush that was usually covered with tiny white flowers—wasn't! Then the leaves had come slowly and never reached their normal size. Within a few weeks they were turning brown and falling off the bush. It must be dead, she had thought. Perhaps the winter had been too hard on it. She hated to see it go, but late in September Paula found her ax and her courage, and chopped the bush down to a stump. She was about to lay the ax to the root when her neighbor stopped her. "Leave the stump through next summer. You never know. New healthy shoots can sprout from stumps that appear to be dead. As long as the roots are alive, there's hope." If there was hope for that stump, Paula thought, maybe there was hope for her seemingly fruitless life as well.

Again this week one of the O Antiphons expresses the spirit of the Advent scriptures. We pray, "Come, Flower of Jesse's stem," echoing Isaiah's spirit of hopeful expectation that a Messiah would sprout forth and flower from the seemingly dead stump of Jesse's family tree, inaugurating God's kingdom of justice and peace. We pray, "Sign for all peoples," conveying Paul's message that Jesus Christ showed God's faithfulness to the hopes of the patriarchs as well as mercy to the Gentiles. We pray, "Let nothing keep you from coming to our aid," reflecting John the Baptist's confidence that the Messiah and his kingdom are indeed "at hand."
