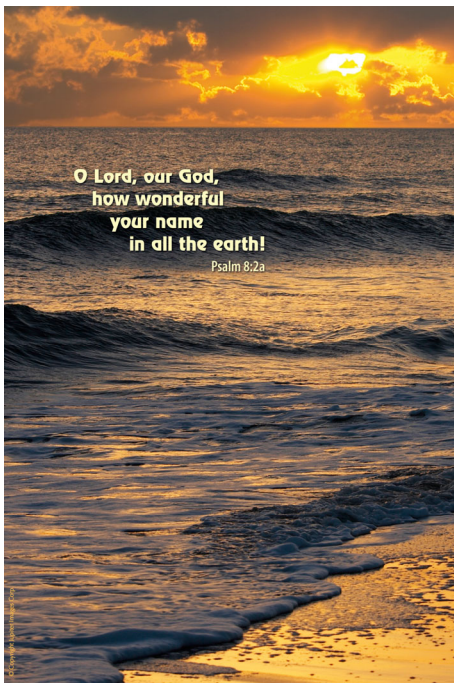

RECONCILED DIVERSITY

A few years ago, during Rome's quiet summer, Pope Francis took a day off to visit privately with some old friends, whose identity took Catholic Italy by surprise: Evangelical Protestants. They welcomed Francis to their Pentecostal Church of Reconciliation, where Francis asked pardon for Catholic persecutions and celebrated the Holy Spirit's "pentecostal work."

Unlike Satan, declared Francis, who creates division among God's children, the Holy Spirit creates a diversity rich and beautiful. And unity; not uniformity, Francis specified, but unity in diversity. Francis named the Spirit's gift "reconciled diversity."

Pentecost's rich treasury of scriptural readings, for Saturday's vigil and Sunday's morning liturgy, traces the Holy Spirit's work from creation's beginning, through Jesus' resurrection, into the church's earliest days, now into our days. Kindled in our hearts, the Spirit's gentle fire is ours to share generously, even with those most strikingly different from us. All hearts are Spirit-warmed by reconciled diversity. Copyright © J. S. THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

THE LOVE OF GOD HAS BEEN POURED INTO OUR HEARTS THROUGH THE SPIRIT OF GOD DWELLING WITHIN US, ALLELUIA. ROMANS 5:5

All of us have been baptized into one and the same Spirit (2), who bears witness that we are children of God (2b). That same Spirit, the Advocate, was given as gift to the disciples (1) to teach them everything (3b) and to strengthen them to go forth in the name of the Lord (3), "to renew the face of the earth" (Ps).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s.

Color experts tell us that red is a hot color, best used for fast-paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment, draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Last week we celebrated the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church. This week's scriptures continue to explore the gift of the Holy Spirit, but this time they focus on how the gift of the Holy Spirit binds the church to God in a holy communion of love.

In John's Gospel we hear of the closeness of the Father and the Son. Jesus says, "Everything the Father has is mine" and that the Spirit will pass on what Jesus has to us. The Letter to the Romans helps us realize what it is that we have received: The holy love that is shared between Father and Son "has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5:5). Not only does our God "delight in the human race" (Proverbs 8:31), care for us, and crown us with glory and honor (Psalm 8:6); through the gift of the Spirit God binds us in a holy communion to the eternal love of the Trinity.

Stepping Stones Moving Forward!

Father Tyler, along with Father Alfhones, Father Eliseo, some members of the Core Team Design Sub-Committee and Core Team Chairperson, Paula Thiessen, had dinner with Bishop Taylor while he was in NWA to celebrate Confirmation on May 4. We have communicated with the Diocese throughout the early planning stages for construction of a church, just as we did for the land purchase. Before we get to the formal approval process required by the Diocese for new construction, we believe it is important to keep both the Bishop and the Diocesan Building Commission up-to-date and informed of our progress.

Bishop Taylor agrees that we need a church and is supportive of our desire for a traditional design.

The Bishop recommends that we continue:

- ✓ our programming work (defining what we need and where within the building);
- ✓ our research for the best site to build a church, given the land that we purchased;
- ✓ our research on the pros and cons of new versus used/repurposed liturgical art, stained glass, and furnishings for the church.

All of this preliminary work will help us to be fiscally responsible and value engineer the overall cost of the project. Time is on our side to plan and construct the timeless, permanent church that our parishioners desire and which meets our needs in a fiscally responsible manner.

We ask for your continued support of our Phase III Building Fund collections. All funds collected will be deposited into a savings account and go directly towards costs associated with the construction of our church.

History of St. Joseph Master Plan

The Master's Plan is a three phase project that began in 1996, when Fr. Mark Wood organized the Parish Core Team, an advisory body, charged with the planning and implementation of construction projects to meet the demands of our growing parish.

- 1872-2002** -By the mid 90's our growing parish and school, located on Lafayette St., had outgrown our land-locked facilities. In 1995, with no room for expansion, the Parish Council, Finance Council and School Board ratified the Long Range Planning committee's recommendation to relocate.
- 1996** -Fr. Mark Wood charged the Core Team to find suitable land to relocate our church and school.
- 1997** -18.57 acres of pastureland were purchased on Starr Drive (on land originally purchased in 1844 by Fr. John Corry to settle a Catholic presence in NWA, now St. Joseph Parish).
- 1997-2000** -The original plan was to build a Church on Starr Drive and leave the School on Lafayette Street, establishing a dual campus. Due diligence proved this plan was not feasible. Unable to financially budget the operation of two campuses, finance the multi-million dollar church mortgage, and provide meeting space on Starr Drive for parish groups after weekend Masses, it was determined that we needed to move as one. In 1999, Fr. John Antony and the Core Team designed our multipurpose Chapel Center and Education Facility-**Phase I**- that was in our price range to meet the needs of the entire parish.
- 2000-2006** -Father Paul Worm and the Core Team continued work to complete the **Phase I** project. We moved into our multi-purpose facility in 2002 bringing us back to our roots on the original pre-1872 Catholic property. Father Paul and the team began work on **Phase II** to plan our next project and the best locations for future construction.
- 2008** -After retiring the **Phase I** debt, with the parish's continued growth, our building was unable to accommodate the demands for meeting space for all of our groups and classes. Fr. Bradley Barber brought Core Team together to continue work on **Phase II**.
- 2009-12** -Focus groups, parish statistics, budgets and the original plan were considered. Needs were identified and four master site plans were presented to the parish. The **Phase II** DeBriyn Family Activity Center and classroom/meeting space addition, which included rooms/spaces postponed during **Phase I** due to budget constraints, opened in February 2012.
- 2010** -Our vision of a church as originally presented has always been on the table. During **Phase II** planning, Fr. John Antony asked the Core Team to envision architectural plans and research locations for a future church. In addition to the 1997 design, four parish architects were consulted and snapshots of possible designs for a traditional style, 1000+ seats, east-west orientation Church were reviewed.
- 2014-15** -Having paid off our **Phase II** building debt in 2013, Fr. Shaun Wesley reorganized the Core Team to plan for **Phase III** – a freestanding Church, which will free space in our current facility providing additional room for future ministry needs of the school and the church.
- 2016-17** -Father Jason Tyler and the Core Team continued to study the best location for **Phase III** -a new church. 7.5+ acres of adjacent land meeting the best site criteria for a church were purchased in January 2017.
- 2019** -Retired land loan. We are debt free and all donations to the Building Fund will be deposited into a savings account to go directly towards costs associated with the construction of our church.

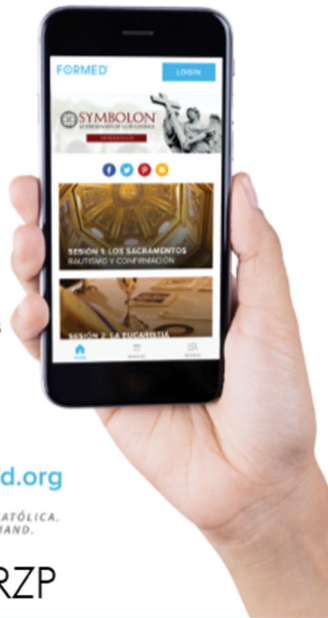

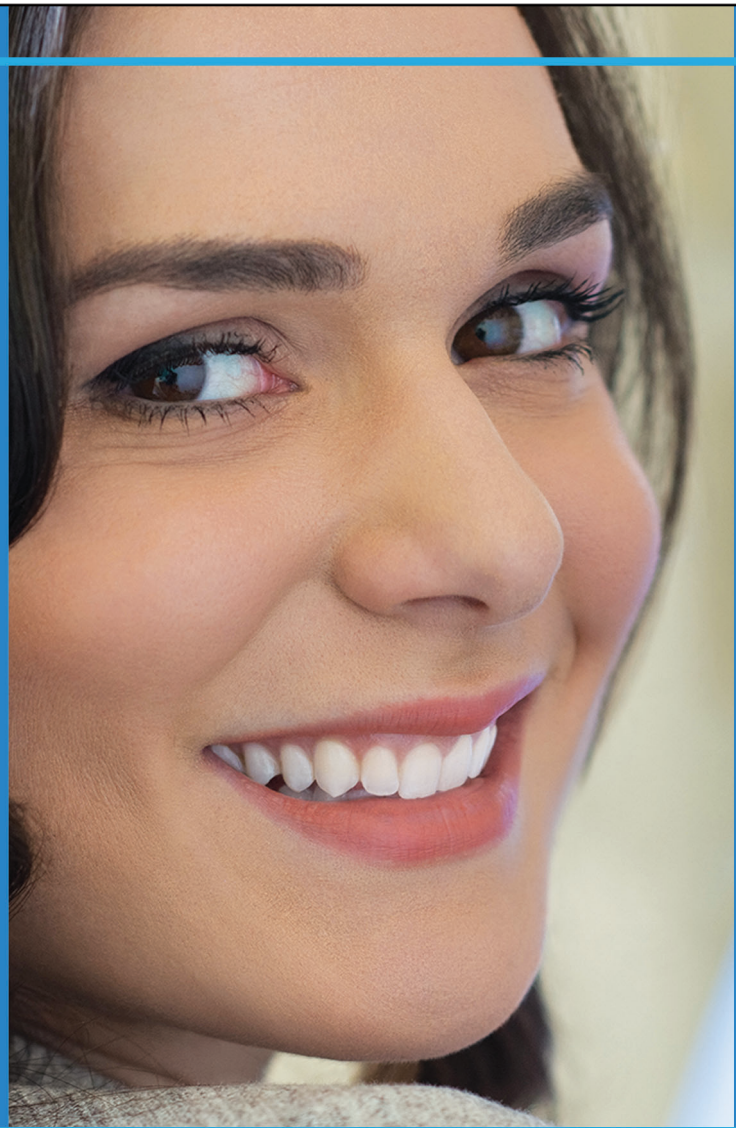

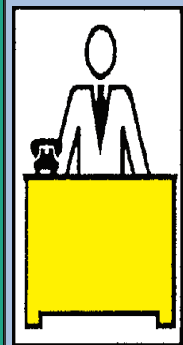
